Dear Friends,


Happy Spring!

Apr 13th: Enjoy an afternoon with John Flynn, a singer-songwriter and self-described "folkslinger" whose social justice commitment is likened to Pete Seeger and Woody Guthrie. John is known for smart, heart-centered lyrics and stirring songs of social justice. The former Nashville staff-writer has released thirteen albums in a career spanning four decades, and also runs New Beginnings-Next Step, a 501(c)3 dedicated to fighting recidivism and counseling folks completing prison terms. This concert is part of Fallsington Friends Quaker Meeting social justice singer/songwriter series. The cost for the concert is \$15.

Spiritual Life Program

Apr 28th: Joyce Hinnefeld will introduce the work of Shining Light (www.shining-light.com), a Pennsylvaniabased organization that works with incarcerated individuals in multiple states, "providing innovative, evidence-based reentry programming that transforms the lives of participants and prison environments, resulting in lower recidivism, better neighbors, and stronger communities." Joyce works as a facilitator with the Shining Light Academy program, which features class sessions addressing character strengths, creative writing, playwriting, and more, and culminates in the creation of "Wellness Recovery Action Plans," or WRAPS. She also helps with creative writing pages for Shining Light's bimonthly magazine, The Loop. We will view some of Shining Light's powerful videos (in which professional actors and dancers present the work of incarcerated individuals) and perhaps listen to excerpts from recent episodes of the podcast Chainz 2 Changed, produced at the North Dakota State Penitentiary, featuring several members of the Shining Light staff.
