Spotlight on November Quarterly Meeting

Report from Ad Hoc Group considering Quakertown Meeting's Minute of Concern Regarding the Supreme Court's Decision Reversing Roe v. Wade

At our August Quarterly Meeting, Friends in attendance stood in support of [Quakertown's Minute](#) and with minor revisions approved a Minute of those gathered, with one Friend being recorded for standing aside. It was requested that an Ad Hoc group meet and consider the next steps for Friends, prior to our November Quarterly Meeting.

Our Ad Hoc group met twice and came up with the following suggested ways that individuals can put beliefs and values into action:

- Write a Letter to the Editor expressing ones concerns about a woman's reproductive choices being her own, to your local or state publications (on-line or in print).
- Contact your local, state & federal legislative representatives to express your concerns. You can do this by making an appointment to meet with them in person, call and speak with one of their interns or write a post card, letter or email to voice your support of women's rights.

- Donate time, talent and/or money to NARAL or Center for Reproductive Rights to support legislative action.
- Partner with existing groups such as Planned Parenthood, local abortion providers and the Justice Fund to help low income folks receive the care they are asking for.
- Seek out and join in marches and forums that bear public witness in support of reproductive rights & freedom.
- Spread the word; talk to your friends, relatives and neighbors about where you stand on a woman's right to choose whether or not to continue a pregnancy.

While this ad hoc group has completed their assigned task, many Friends continue to work hard to stand up for a person's right to control their own body and if you want to connect with others in this work please reach out to either one of us or to our Bucks Quarter Coordinator, Wendy Kane who can put you in touch with like minded Quakers.

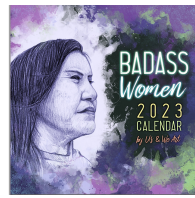

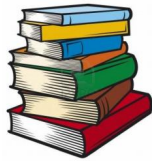
