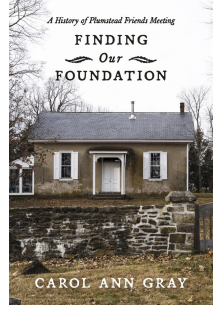

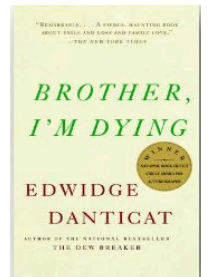

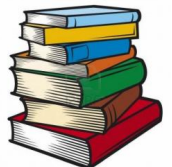

## Anti-Racism Collaborative

The Antiracism Collaborative (ARC) continues to live into its possibilities. A part of each meeting we hold monthly is devoted to visioning, during which members throw out ideas of where to head next on our journey to helping meetings walk the antiracism path. Some admittedly are a little wild and crazy and get put on the shelf for future discernment, but sometimes a vision resonates with others, and we work on it to birth it into existence.

That's what happened with a vision last month. We were looking at two of our goals: #3) Visit meetings to invite others to join us in learning and doing anti-racism work; and #4) Provide or assist meetings with classes, programs, and workshops on anti-racism. We figured monthly meetings weren't all back to in-person meetings and weren't feeling the whole visiting idea yet. But we all have a Quarterly Meeting assigned to us that we go to and let them know what we're up to from another one of our goals.

The ARC has confidence in what monthly meetings are doing and would like to be of support. Green Street Meeting gave a presentation about reparations not only of money but also about relationships. Many meetings are holding regular vigils. We plan to train people in Deep Listening to teach and lead Trust, Truth, and Transformation circles at various levels in Monthly and Quarterly Meetings as well as Philadelphia Yearly Meeting. We welcome input.

The collaborative regularly collects ideas and resources – and we have seen in the survey that meetings are doing important things. As part of offering resources to get people thinking (one on reparations is being worked on), why not also gather stories – what Meetings are doing – and share on the website for others to take that they want or need?

So, as we announced at Quarterly Meetings, send us your stories about your Monthly Meeting's antiracism path so other Meetings can learn from you. We're on this path together and sharing is caring.
