# THE TWELVE STEPS AS SPIRITUAL PRACTICE Makefield Meeting Adult First Day School March 2019

This March at Makefield Friends Meeting, Maia Simon will lead four sessions of Adult First Day School with a look at the Twelve Steps, which first were defined by the founders of Alcoholics Anonymous and are now used by many other programs for addiction and for emotional and relationship wellness. One need not have or acknowledge an addiction to participate in these discussions; we are examining the steps as spiritual practice.

The last of the Twelve Steps says, "Having had a spiritual awakening as a result of these steps, we tried to carry the message to others who still suffer and to practice these principles in all our affairs." Indeed, the Twelve Steps are a program intended to help one find conscious contact with a 'Higher Power'; it is a program for spiritual formation and growth.

This program at Makefield Meeting is based on a weekend workshop Maia has delivered at Pendle Hill called 'Beyond Abstinence; Taking The Steps To Happy, Joyous, And Free.'

Adult First Day School at Makefield meets from 11:15 to noon each Sunday of the month except the second. First Day School is preceded by meeting for worship from 10:00 to 10:45 a.m. and light refreshments thereafter. # WHAT I'VE LEARNED DURING MY TEN YEARS IN IMMIGRATION LAW, & FIVE YEARS WITH DETAINEES AT THE BERKS COUNTY RESIDENTIAL CENTER

(detention center)

On **March 4th** there will be a discussion led by Jackie Kline from Aldea, the People's Justice Center at Unami Friends Meeting from 9:30-10:45AM.

What would you do if sitting next to your first client at the Berks County Detention Center were five more on the bench? If every time you came to see a client, there were others there? Jacqueline Kline will be speaking to us about her experiences with the law firm that she and partner Bridget Cambria began (five years ago on March 4!).

Their clients have been traumatized in their country of origin, and then traumatized here, so in 2016 Jackie and Bridget (along with Carolanne Donohue of Reading Friends Meeting) founded the non-profit Aldea, the People's Justice Center, to address the many issues that immigrants face in this country, e.g., getting their child into school, getting a SS card, etc. Aldea has built long-term relationships with the people they've served. Two individuals who've won asylum joined Aldea's board of directors, and one of them has testified in Congress and before Amnesty International.

Jackie anticipates talking for a short time and then answering questions. Her experience includes working with DACA recipients and victims of domestic violence. She'll be bringing along her 14-month-old son, so child care will be provided!
