

10:00–11:00 am Program: Creating Spiritual Autobiographies in Partnership with Incarcerated Women: A Lehigh Valley Monthly Meeting Project. In the spring and early summer of this year, several Lehigh Valley members and attenders participated in the writing of spiritual autobiographies, drawing on exercises in Dan Wakefield's book The Story of Your Life: Writing a Spiritual Autobiography. In addition, they shared poems, drawings, and portions of their autoriographies with incarcerated women at Pennsylvania's Muncy State Correctional Institution, communicating via U.S. Mail and/or the prison messaging system, and invited their partners to produce and share similar work. At this session, facilitated by Lehigh Valley member Joyce Hinnefeld, participants will discuss this project, including the discoveries gleaned through writing their own spiritual autobiographies and through sharing stories and experiences with their incarcerated partners.

Friends gathered at 12:47 pm and settled into a period of worship.

Welcome - Bill Daly

Review and Approval of Agenda - Approved

Roll Call of Meetings: Bristol – 0; Buckingham – 3; Doylestown – 3; Fallsington – 12; Lehigh Valley – 2; Makefield – 1; Middletown – 3; Newtown – 8; Plumstead – 2; Quakertown – 3; Solebury – 2; Southampton – 4; Wrightstown – 2; Yardley – 3

Review and Approval of Minutes from May 15 Quarterly Meeting-Approved

Stories of Vitality & Strength – Solebury Friend reports Ujima Friends Peace Center visited Solebury Friends. Lehigh Valley Friend reports hosting summer picnics: these have been restorative to the membership; example: 26 Lehigh Valley Friends took a trip on Joshua White canal boat ride. Buckingham Friend reports that Buckingham Friends School is very near capacity enrollment and is refurbishing/remodeling/rebuilding buildings with an eye toward sustainability. Yardley Friend reports that they will host their 66th Annual Flea Market – it has energized the members. Middletown Friend reports that three women doctors with Middletown connections will be added to a mural behind the World Travel Building in Langhorne. Southampton Friend reports that they held a gathering last weekend at which many former young members of Southampton rejoined meeting. Lehigh Valley Friend wonders what percentage of Friends attend Buckingham Friends School – 6.5% last year; uncertain about this year; Buckingham Friend reports that scholarships are available for Buckingham Friends School; Doylestown Friend wonders what percentage of Quaker youth apply and what percentage are accepted – difficult number to calculate; four teachers are Friends.

Special Report - Bucks County Advocacy Teams (BCAT) - Betsy Crofts - reports on work with FCNL

Special Report – 342nd PYM Annual Sessions Summary – Bethann Morgan – Outstanding annual sessions this year; the epistle was particularly inspiring; Bethann suggests that Friends visit the website to see for themselves what was discerned; Bethann reports that 2023 Budget is balanced and encourages financial support of PYM; DEI Deep Listening teams project not going forward at this time; monthly meetings are encouraged to support Ujima Friends Peace Center; Abington Minute read; Federal Truth and Healing Commission is supported by PYM to address genocidal practices of boarding schools for indigenous youth in 19th and early 20th century; PYM requests climate steward from each monthly meeting – part of climate crisis group see Earth Care Witness website; membership and belonging, At-Large Membership is now a reality; important to support PYM Committees; new PYM Clerk Melissa Rycroft and Rising Clerk is Nikki Mosgrove.

Budget & Nominating Committee Report – Leo Fitzpatrick – the committee met at the end of July; brings forward a request for Lisa Parry Becker to rise to the position of Treasurer – **APPROVED.**

Ed Snyder nominates himself as Assistant Treasurer so that he can assist Lisa – **APPROVED.** Leo reported that the committee approved updating their QuickBooks software to a cloud-based model; the committee has not identified a rising clerk; the committee brought request for Bill Dockhorn to join audit committee – **APPROVED.**

Annual Report – Yardley – Marna Matthews (full report attached):

Special Minute – Quakertown MM, re Roe v Wade (minute attached) Lisa Uchrin: Quakertown Monthly Meeting is asking you to support our belief that a woman has the absolute right to control her own body and to make reproductive decisions within the privacy of her own counsel, the counsel of her doctor and the guidance of the Spirit. Although Quakertown Monthly Meeting is in the State of New Jersey, where, presently, our Governor and our legislators are working to protect a woman's right to control her own body and her right to privacy, we are still concerned about our fellow Americans whose rights have been grossly compromised through the Supreme Court's recent reversal of its 1974 decision in Roe v. Wade. Access to safe, legal, reproductive care is a fundamental human right and a necessity to protect women from the dangers of forced pregnancies or illegal abortions.

Discussion: Clerk tests sense of meeting: at this point in time, can we support this minute as amended? **APPROVED** (with Makefield Friend standing aside).

Clerk asks for committee to recommend further action; an ad-hoc committee was formed to explore what steps, if any, the Quarter would like to take in support of this minute. Friends who volunteered were Wendy Kane (Newtown), Bethann Morgan (Buckingham), Lisa Uchrin (Quakertown), Marna Matthews (Yardley) and Terry Christensen (Yardley). Wendy volunteered to act as convenor.

Audit report – FYs ending 2020, 2021, 2022 – Bill Daly – Bill notes that for a variety of reasons we have gone without an audit for three years; however, given the hour, we will ask the audit committee to resume its work expeditiously and revisit this issue at our next meeting.

Announcements – Quakertown recommends Pendle Hill Pamphlet Radical Transformation; the coordinator announces the Peace Fair and volunteers to deliver yard sights to monthly meetings.

Closing Worship – There being no further business before us, the meeting settled in worship at 3:47 PM and was adjourned at 3:50 PM.

Our next gathering will be on the 20th Day, Eleventh Month, 2022, under the care of Lehigh Valley Monthly Meeting.
