Historic Marker Dedication at Nixon Cemetery

On October 2nd at 2 pm, Quakertown Friends Meeting will hold a dedication ceremony for an historic marker that honors

the Nixon Cemetery, a burial site for non-Quakers that the Meeting offered to the community in the mid-1700s. The sign also acknowledges the now forgotten site, across the road, of a former cemetery for enslaved Africans, also founded in the mid-1700s, but destroyed before the 1880s.

The dedication ceremony will include several speakers, and refreshments will be available afterwards at Quakertown Meeting, a half mile away from the cemetery. Parking available at both locations.



PYM Grants **Greenleaf Grants:** The deadline to apply for a Greenleaf Grant through PYM is October 31st.

What is a Greenleaf Grant? The Greenleaf Fund provides grants and loans to elderly Quakers, and those in sympathy

with Quakers, who are of modest means and in need of assistance to meet their housing needs and other costs of living. Individuals who are 62 years of age or older can apply; grants are not available for organizations. There are two deadlines every year, on May 1 and November 1.

The Greenleaf Fund was established from the funds of the former Greenleaf Boarding Home to maintain the values that guided that organization: caring, compassion, confidentiality, and respect for all residents of the home.

Applications are being accepted via email to grants@pym.org. Paper copies are accepted but their receipt may take longer to acknowledge as many staff people are working from home during the pandemic.

PYM Emergency Grants can help support PYM's Monthly Meeting's by granting up to \$2,000 in one-time emergency assistance to members of monthly meetings. These funds may also be used to supplement each Meeting's own emergency assistance fund in helping members meet basic needs (including but not limited to housing, food, employment, and medical difficulties) during times of personal financial crisis. Applications must come from the Clerks of PYM Meetings or Clerks of Care, Counsel, and Overseers committees.

Clerks requesting funds should write to the Director of Grant Making at ngutowski@pym.org, and follow up with a brief and concise letter of request describing the need and individuals involved. Individuals cannot apply and beneficiaries must be PYM members. There are no deadlines — applications are processed as they are received.

Afghan Refugee information Many Friends in Bucks Quarter have asked how they themselves or their meeting communities can help with the increase in the number of refugees that will need resettlement. PYM held a conference call on September 9th to

address this issue. If you were unable to attend, information from that call as well as a video recording <u>can</u> be accessed here.

Earth Quaker Action Team EQAT's September newsletter reviewed how for the past six years they have been pushing PECO to invest in our communities through local solar and green jobs. This pressure has resulted in PECO taking significant steps that have

boosted the local solar economy and put some investment in job creation for black and brown community members.

EQAT is handing off the baton for continued changes with PECO to other partner organizations who they feel can take this cause to the next level. Going forward, EQAT plans to join an international campaign targeting Vanguard, the world's largest investor in coal and #2 funder of major climate-harming projects across the globe.
