**BQ Outreach Grants**

**Grant summary:** In fiscal year 2021-22 Bucks Quarterly Meeting offered \$500 grants to monthly meetings to support their outreach efforts. Thirteen meetings applied for and received the grants; this is their outreach:

- Buckingham:** WiFi for the meetinghouse.
- Doylestown:** to defray costs for outreach at the Doylestown Arts Festival
- Fallsington:** to boost social media posts on Facebook and purchase books we can gift to new attenders and seekers
- Lehigh Valley:** to support the purchase of equipment for hybrid worship
- Makefield:** hybrid equipment and upgrades to signage
- Middletown:** to cover the monthly cost for an internet hotspot
- Newtown:** a Welcome Neighbor postcard and mailing
- Plumstead:** donation of \$250 each to refugee resettlement and local food pantry
- Quakertown:** printing brochures, pamphlets, cards and posters
- Solebury:** to cover the costs of a website designer to upgrade their current website
- Southampton:** distribution of funds to five area food banks and assistance programs
- Wrightstown:** restart the coffeehouse they had before pandemic
- Yardley:** To cover costs for Movies under the Stars Summer 2022.

Each meeting will include how their grant money was used and the outcome of the outreach effort in their annual reports. **African American Museum of Bucks County**

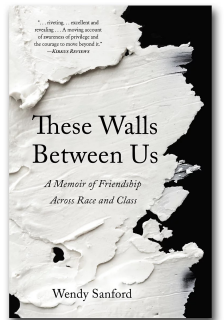
The museum’s director, Linda Salley, presented a wonderful program about creating the museum’s new home at Boone Farm, and some of the joys and challenges that they are facing.

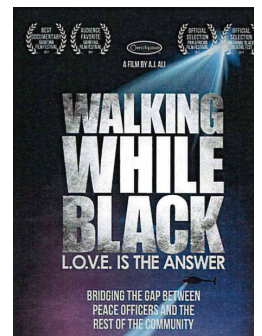

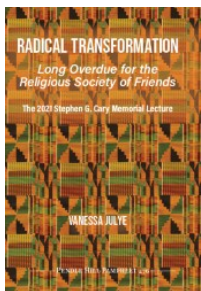
